The Stations of the Cross

The devotion of the **Stations of the Cross**, popular during Lent and Holy Week, goes back to the earliest centuries of the church. Many people wanted to walk the land where Jesus lived and trace his path from the **Garden of Olives** to the hill of **Calvary** and through to the tomb in a garden. Yet many couldn't get to Jerusalem, or if they could, only once in a lifetime on pilgrimage. They desired to follow literally in the footsteps of **Crucified Master and Risen Lord**. This led to the ritual devotion of walking the Way of the Cross based on the scriptures usually in their local church or sometimes outdoors.

Over time, depending on who designed the devotion, pieces were added that were not in the Scriptures. Someone named **Veronica** added herself in, it is thought, as part of the devotional practice. She is not mentioned anywhere in the gospels.

Christians found it difficult to stand up to evil and resist sin, so they added the three stations of Jesus falling, though the bible does not record that he did so. And because of the great devotion to the **Mary**, they added a station where **Mary** holds the body of her lifeless son, Jesus, in her arms before placing him in the tomb, the **Pieta** (a Michelangelo masterpiece).

Many other stations were added as well, sometimes totaling twenty or more, as the faithful sought ways to personalize and experience the way Jesus walked on the earth, especially during the season of **Lent** and **Holy Week**.
