'This day we sailed on'

When Christopher Colombus was sailing to discover America, he wasn't quite sure where he was going or what would happen along the way. All sorts of things did happen: the crew mutinied, the food went bad, the water went low, and there were terrible storms. And he recorded all these things in the ship's log, but he finished each day's entry with one sentence, 'This day we sailed on' That's almost like a parable for life, sometimes you wonder where it's all heading and all kinds of things happen but you keep going, 'This day we sailed on'

That's what saves the world and it's people, day by difficult day, doing the best they can in the face of all kinds of trials. In today's gospel **Jesus** tells us he is the "*Living Bread that's come down from heaven*" He is the living bread that sustains us on the journey of life.
