Feast Days

Oct 15th St Teresa of Avila (1515-1582)

Teresa was a mystic, a religious reformer, the author of four books, and one of the outstanding masters of Christian prayer.

Oct 17th St Ignatius of Antioch

Ignatius died a martyr in Rome in the second century.

Oct. 18th St Luke

St Luke is one of the four evangelists. He is the author of the third gospel. He is the patron saint of doctors.

St John Henry Newman

John Henry Newman, an English man who was a convert to Catholicism, is being canonized a saint in **Rome** today. As a young Anglican priest, Newman travelled to Italy. There he became ill and was forced to remain in Palermo for three weeks. Eventually he set sail for **England**; and in the **Mediterranean** Sea his boat was becalmed for a week, between **Corsica** and **Sardinia**. During that week, in **June 1833**, Newman wrote the famous hymn **Lead Kindly Light**. The words of the hymn express Newman's anxiety about the future and his faith in God's purpose: 'So long thy power hath blest me, sure it still will lead me on'

Lead, Kindly light, amidst th'encircling gloom
Lead Thou me on!
The night is dark, I am far from homeLead Thou me on!
Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see
The distant seen -- one step enough for me.

This was the final hymn at the last service on the **Titanic**

Cardinal Newman was instrumental in setting up the Catholic University of Ireland on St Stephen's Green in 1854 which eventually evolved into the present day, **University College Dublin**.
