Feast Days

July 22nd Mary Magdalene

Except for Mary mother of Jesus, few women are more honoured in the bible than Mary Magdalene. Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who assisted Jesus and the Twelve out of their means" She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses that might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to which the priveledge was given.

Sowing the Seed

As with the farmer in today's gospel, much of what Jesus scattered was lost: his teaching and preaching: it met with little or no response from his listeners. Indeed his gracious words often met with hostility. Yet, **Jesus** knew that some people were taking his words to heart and that would be enough to bring about **God's Kingdom**.

In speaking this parable, **Jesus** may have been speaking a word of encouragement to his disciples, saying to them, "Despite all the setbacks, the opposition and hostility, God is at work and that work will lead to something wonderful' In other words the seed is good and powerful. Despite, against the odds, we must keep sowing.

We are as much in need of **Jesus'** encouraging words today as the disciples were then.
