# **Forgiveness**

When **Peter** asked **Jesus** how often he should forgive 7 times? -he probably expected **Jesus** to say, that 7 times was too many. As a matter of fact, two highly respected rabbis of his time taught that 3 times were the limit. Instead **Jesus** says 77 times. In other words there must be no limit on our readiness to forgive. That's a tall order! It goes deeply against the grain, especially when we have suffered wounds that are slow to heal.

How can God expect this of us? Just think for a moment what your anger is doing to you.. Listen to the beginning of the first reading today from the book of Ecclesiasticus. It says "*Resentment and anger, these are foul things*" If you ever nursed a grudge for a long time, you know how resentment can eat you up. In wishing we could hurt others, we do damage to ourselves.

If I have been badly treated, I have good reason to be resentful, and I don't have to apoligiee for it. If I don't feel up to forgiving, then I must pray for the grace to do so. **God** doesn't ask for the impossible; he only asks us to do our best with his help.
