'Look There is the Lamb of God..'

When I was a child, if either I or my brothers pointed at something, my mother would always say, 'Don't point' Pointing was always considered bad manners, at least for children. There are times of course, when pointing is considered appropriate especially if you are giving someone directions.

In today's gospel reading, John the Baptist points to Jesus so as to direct people to him. Seeing Jesus coming towards him, John declared 'Look there is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of

Most of us can think of people who, in the course of our lives, pointed us in the right direction. These were people who could see just that little bit more clearly than we could at the time.
