Feast Days

Oct. 24th St Anthony Claret (1807-1870)

He is known as 'the spiritual father of Cuba' He was a Spanish missionary whose work took him to the Canary islands, Cuba, Madrid and Paris. In his spare time he worked as a weaver and designer in the textile mills of Barcelona.

Oct. 28th St Simon & Jude (apostles)

These are two of the lesser known Apostles. Jude is named Thaddeus in the Gospel of Matthew and Mark.

Simon is called "the Zealot" an extreme Jewish nationalist sect.

Humble Prayer

Humility means seeing ourselves as we are in reality and that's what today's Gospel is about.

Jesus used parables like this one to shock people into reality. For generations the people of Jesus' time had been strictly adhering to **Jewish law** to assure their own salvation. The tax collector symbolized a lax Jew and one who co-operated with the hated Roman enemy. The idea that God could approve of a tax collector over a Pharisee was shocking.

The tax-collector's prayer, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" expressed what Jesus had been teaching, but the Pharisees weren't hearing: salvation is God's gift, dependent solely on God's mercy. The tax collector had come to terms with this reality

In fact the tax collector's eight word prayer is one of the sources of the ancient **Jesus prayer** which originated in the **Middle Eastern** deserts in the earliest days of Christianity. To use this prayer, simply recite the words, "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner" Repeating this prayer many times through the day can remind us of the reality that is most reassuring: **God's presence and mercy will see us through.**Judy Hoelzeman
