Sts Cosmas and Damien

Cosmas and Damien were two martyrs in the early church. Sept. 27th St Vincent De Paul (1580-1660)

St Vincent was a native of Gascony, France. He founded the **Vincentians**, a religious order, who devoted their time to the spiritual care of the people in the smaller towns and villages in that area of France. Later, Vincent formed a charity for the physical relief of the poor and the sick in each parish.

Facing the truth

It can be especially difficult to listen to people when they are sharing something with us that we find difficult to hear. They may be sharing some painful experience that is troubling and disturbing. We struggle to listen to their story because it arouses painful emotions in us. Someone might be trying to tell us something about ourselves that we find difficult to hear.

In today's gospel reading Jesus had something very important to say about what was about to happen to him. He was telling the disciples that he would be delivered into the hands of others and that he would be put to death. This was something they found very hard to hear. This was a truth they were not ready to take on board. '**They did not understand what he said and was afraid to ask'** They were afraid that they might not be able to live with the answers he would give them.

Yet, in our heart of hearts, we often recognize that there are certain realities we need to face, even if they are painful. There are certain illusions we may have to let go of.

The disciples seemed to have thought that being part of Jesus' circle would bring them privilege and status. He needed to prise them away from these illusions of greatness that they clung to. They wanted power, a kind of self-centered ambition that the second reading describes. God's ambition described as 'the wisdom that comes from above', is an ambition to serve. As the gospel says 'Those who want to be first must make themselves last of all and servant of all' This ambition to serve is something that 'makes for peace and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good'. This is something all disciples of Jesus have to take on board.
