'For Crying Out Loud!'

My grandfather had a great phrase when things were getting a bit out of control. When the hordes of his children's children descended upon the quietness of his little kingdom, when things were getting just a little too boisterous for his liking he would declare, **'for crying out loud'** and that was always a sign that things had gone too far and we quickly escaped to the sanctuary of the back garden.

Did Jesus have a **'for crying out loud'** moment when the James and John asked if they should call down fire from heaven? He rebuked them, we do not know what he said, but it is clear the two were put back in their box.

It is worth nothing that the town that rejected Jesus was a Samaritan town. The people did not accept them, or their message, because they were going up to Jerusalem. As we know the Jews and the Samaritans did not get on. James and John were so annoyed at rejection their first response was anger; burn them up Lord! This was not and is not what Jesus wanted; **'For crying out loud'** is that all you have learned from me!'

The message of the Gospel from the beginning of Christianity has been rejected by some. From the beginning until now, there are people who for whatever reason do not or cannot accept the Good news.
