Feast Days July 29th

St Martha

Martha and Mary and their brother Lazarus were close friends of Jesus. It was Martha who said "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" after Jesus restored her brother Lazarus to life.

July 31st St Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556) St Ignatius of Loyola is the founder of the Jesuits. During his convalescence after a cannon ball had shattered his leg, he read the Lives of the Saints. This led to his conversion and religious awakening. Pope Francis is a Jesuit.

Aug. 1stSt Alphonsus Liguori (1696- 1787)

He founded the Redemptorist Congregation in 1732 in Naples, Italy. He is remembered as a popular preacher and an influential writer.

Prayer

When it comes to prayer, we can all feel a little inadequate. We often feel our prayer is not all it could be. This can be discouraging.

St Paul was aware of how we can struggle to pray. In the Letter to the Romans he declares "We do not know how to pray as we aught." And then he adds "The spirit helps us in our weakness.....that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words". Paul is saying that a wordless prayer of the Spirit is going on within us even as we struggle to find words.

In today's gospel Jesus teaches his disciples to pray and he gives them the words to use. The **Lord's Prayer** is our prayer too. It's the first prayer we learn as children and the prayer we turn to in times of crisis.

The opening lines of the **Our Father** are all about honouring or hallowing God's name. Only after those petitions that focus on God does Jesus teach us to focus on our own needs. We are to pray for our daily bread, all that we need each day for our journey through life. We live in an imperfect world. We ourselves are imperfect and we have to deal with imperfect people and, so, we will always stand in need of God's forgiveness. In this world we will be assailed by evils in various forms, which will often put our faith to the test. We need to turn to God to keep us faithful when the trials come.

In today's gospel Jesus is teaching us that prayer is always a going out of ourselves towards God and towards others.
