## What's in the Heart

Jesus has a problem with the **Pharisees** in today's Gospel. The **Pharisees** were pious men who took **God** seriously. They tried to spell out in exact detail, what each of **God's** commandments entailed. For example, journeys were forbidden on the Sabbath. How many steps added up to a journey? The rules were originally meant to preserve the spirit of obedience to God's will, but Jesus saw that the letter of the law was killing the spirit.

Some of us are old enough to remember when we **Catholics** became a bit too legalistic. If a lady didn't wear a hat in church? How late could you come to Mass without committing sin? What constituted 'work on Sundays'. We tried a little too hard to reduce the Christian life to a list of rules and regulations. However, without rules we could get sloppy.

**But God's commandments are ideals. They tell us to honour our parents, to be truthful, to respect one another's persons and property. That's not a catalogue of restrictions; it's a guide to a better life.**

Jesus reminds us that we should respect the law, but not be too rigid. **The Ten Commandments** are meant to be guides, not chains. As Jesus says in another place, the **Sabbath** was made for people, not people for the **Sabbath**. When we obey **God** in this spirit, his commands become a source of genuine truth and life.
