The Temptations

The temptations that we find in today's Gospel reading were somewhat unique to **Jesus.** Yet, they are not without relevance to all of us. Like **Jesus**, we too have been baptized, and like him we too received a calling and a mission on the day of our baptism. We are called to follow **Jesus** and to reveal him to others. That means setting out on a journey that does not lead to short cuts or easy options. Following Jesus today will often mean taking the road less travelled, saying no to what seems very attractive.

When Jesus was saying no to the shortcuts that Satan was suggesting to him, he was really saying no to putting himself first. Rather than putting himself first, he emptied himself, taking the form of a servant. This is our calling too.

As we begin **Lent** we are asked to look at ways we might be less self- serving and more the servant of others. In today's second reading **Paul** reminds us that our baptismal calling is to confess **Jesus** as **Lord**, not just with our lips but in our hearts and with our lives. This will often mean going the long way around for the sake of others rather than taking the short cut, going the extra mile with someone who needs our support. In our own testing times, we can pray in the words of today's psalmist "*My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I thrust*".
