Book of Wisdom

In our lives we find ourselves dealing with complex situations that we could never have anticipated. Knowing what God is asking of us in these situations can be difficult. **We need time to reflect and pray.**

In this weekend’s gospel, Jesus tells two parables which emphasise the importance of sitting down and thinking something through, rather than rushing into something, and discovering too late that the wrong path has been taken. Jesus suggests in these parables that if we are to take the path that God wants us to take, we need to be reflective and prayerful about what we are doing. We need to turn to God’s son and ask him to fill us with his wisdom; we need to open our hearts to God’s spirit from on high.

Although we live in a world where self-sufficiency is highly valued, when it comes to our relationship with God, we are never self-sufficient. We are always beggars. If we are to discover the path that God is asking us to take, we will always need the help that God alone makes available to us.

The gospel reading suggests that the path that God calls us to take will often prove to be the more difficult one. **Jesus travelled that path and it brought him to the cross. It can be the same for us.** Doing the right thing may put ourselves at odds with family friends and peers. As we sometimes say **‘May God direct you’**
