Many people experience moments which prove to be decisive turning points in their life. They reach a crossroads where they are confronted with radically different choices. They re forced to make a fundamental decision after which their life will never be the same again.

Jesus knew such moments in his life. Today's Gospel shows us one of the most decisive of these - his baptism by John in the **Jordan**. This was a turning point in his life. Prior to this he had lived the quiet and secure life of a village carpenter. But all the while he had been hearing a call to something more important. Then his cousin **John** began his work of preaching and baptizing people. Suddenly **Jesus** left his old way of life and opted for a new one - that of a spiritual teacher and preacher. From that moment on his life would never be the same.

Most of us have known moments that have proved turning points in our lives. However, the direction our lives have taken may not be the result of a major decision, but of a series of little decisions.

At our baptism we were pointed in a very specific direction. In baptism we become disciples of **Jesus**. We are called to fight against evil and to love one another. The ultimate question for a Christian is; Am I being true to the direction in which I was pointed at my baptism? Fr Flor McCarthy S D B
