The Irish writer, John McGahern, tells of an incident that happened when he was the writer in residence in Trinity College. A woman came in one day a week to clean his room. In less than an hour she would have everything shinning and in its proper place. She was a charming woman and often they talked as she worked. She told him how she waited each morning for the bus at six o'clock to take her to Trinity College and that she was able to be home in time to cook the family dinner.

Of the professor who occupied the room before McGahern she said "I cleaned his room for fourteen years and he never once spoke to me. I used to say "Good morning" at first, but after a while I didn't say anything. They say he is one of the brainiest men in the whole university, but I say he has the manners of a bowsie."
